STOCKBRIDGE

Mrs. Almina S. Hammond, wife of George Hammond, died at her home on Thursday last. She had suffered from a cancer nearly three years, when it was removed about a year ago, but her blood had become so poisoned by it that the wound never healed, and gradually undermined her health until death released her sufferings. Mrs. Hammond was the daughter of George and Betsey Snell, and was born in Stockbridge, Aug. 30, 1836. In 1857 she married and removed to her husband's home, in Gilsim, N.H., where she lived until 1866, when, in company with Mr. Hammond's father, the late Hon. Geo. W. Hammond, M.D., they removed to the present home in Stockbridge. She is survived by her husband, two brothers, Morey Snell, of Stockbridge, and Jay S. Snell, of Kenwood, and two sons, Fred S., of Oneida, and Edwin G., who resides at the old homestead. She was loved and respected by all the sick and afflicted in this vicinity. The funeral was held at her late home on Saturday last, Rev. F. [Frederick] W. Betts, pastor of the First Universalist Church, of Syracuse, officiating.
