Nelson E. Hannah

The death of Nelson E. Hannah, a life long resident of the town of Middlefield, occurred very suddenly Wednesday morning at the home of Hosea Wicks at Lentsville. Mr. Hannah, some two or three years ago, was injured by a horse and at that time retired from his trade as a blacksmith for which he had an enviable reputation for skill the county over. He had been considered, however, in fairly good health, and was about his accustomed activities up to a few minutes before he passed away. He had gone to the Wicks home for a call when the summons came, and he expired in a few minutes as he sat in his chair.

Mr. Hannah was the youngest of three children born to William and Harriet (Hubbell) Hannah, at the Hannah home near the place of his death, November 16, 1860. When about twenty years of age he was united in marriage with Miss Emma R. Smith, whose death occurred June 6, 1910. Surviving is one brother, Homer Hannah, of Middlefield Center and several cousins.

The funeral was held at the Wicks home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. George C. Boorn [Universalist] of Cooperstown officiating. Burial was made at Lakewood cemetery, Cooperstown, beside the grave of his wife.
