ALFRED HANSEN DEATH'S VICTIM

Well Known Man Dies After Three Months' Illness at His Home in Nelliston

FORT PLAIN—Alfred G. Hansen, 54, died Monday at his home in Nelliston after an illness of about three months from complications. During that time he had been for a short period receiving treatment, but returned home several weeks ago.

He was born April 3, 1877 in Nelliston, a son of William and Sophia Taubman Hansen. With the exception of five years spent in New York city, Mr. Hansen lived in Fort Plain and Nelliston. He was a furniture finisher by occupation and for many years had been employed at the Hix Furniture plant in Fort Plain.

He was a member of Fort Plain Lodge, 433, F. and A. M. He is survived by his widow, who was formerly Miss Susan Mereness of Fort Plain; two brothers, Paul and William Hansen, Canajoharie; two sisters, Mrs. Martha Thomas, Nelliston, and Mrs. Frank Benjamin, Canajoharie.

Funeral service, Masonic, at his late home Wednesday at 2 p.m. at the Catherine Nellis Memorial Chapel, Rev. Rufus H. Dix, pastor of Fort Plain Universalist church officiating. Interment will be made in the Fort Plain cemetery.
