LEVI HARD

The worst fears of the friends and physicians of Mr. Levi Hard, who sustained serious injuries by being thrown from his carriage August 18th, have proven too well founded, Mr. Hard's death occurring on Friday last. The following brief sketch of his life is furnished by our Kendall correspondent:

Mr. Levi Hard, who was thrown from his carriage a few weeks since, died on Friday last from injuries received then. Mr. Hard was born April 2d, 1810, at Whitehall, Washington county, N.Y. He came to Orleans county in 1825, and was for some time employed in the wool carding and cloth dressing works at Holley. In 1843 he purchased and located on the farm where he died. He has served the town as supervisor and as assessor. Mr. Hard was three times married: first on February 5, 1834, to Rozetta Lake, who died Dec. 5, 1844; second, Dec. 24, 1845, to Mary Hopkins, of Clarendon, who died Feb. 7, 1866; and the third time, to Polly I. Dutton, of Murray, Dec. 31, 1867. Mr. Hard was very much respected by all his acquaintances. He was a member of the Universalist church. His virtues were known during his life so that it will not be necessary to record them on marble that the people may know that he was a good man and honorable citizen.
