DEATHS.

In Monticello, N.Y., Tuesday, March 19th, Mr. HEBER HARRINGTON, aged 88 years. The deceased was born in Canterbury, Windham co., Ct., in the year 1773. He married Hannah Whitford, daughter of David Whitford, formerly of Rhode Island. He was one of the early settlers in the county of Otsego, having removed from Canterbury to Plainfield in the year 1810. Quiet and blameless, he was one of those who form around themselves a sphere of sympathy and love, and find in home affections and the discharge of social duties, the chief happiness of their lives. Possessed of a decided conviction of the truth of Universalism, he was a firm believer in the Fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man. He was privileged for many years to listen to the ministrations of the venerable Dolphus Skinner. His bereaved widow and family have lost an affectionate husband and father. May it work out for them a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory. The funeral was attended in the Universalist church at Bridgewater, on Thursday, the 21st ult., by a large concourse of sympathizing friends, and a discourse delivered by the writer, assisted in the services by Rev.
