Donald B. Harris

This community was deeply saddened Friday morning, June 28th, by the death of Donald B. Largely attended funeral services conducted by the Rev. F. [Fred] G. Leonard of the Universalist church of which the deceased was a constant attendant, were held at the family residence in Morris Sunday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock. The bearers were the four great uncles, Melvin Lull and William Lull of Syracuse; H. H. Cole and Almon E. Lull of Morris. Interment was in the family plot on the hill in the old part of Hillington cemetery.
