Deaths.

In Covington, Ky., Sept. 19, Mr. GEORGE HART, aged 49 years. Having business in Kentucky which required his constant attention, Mr. Hart had spent the greater portion of last year there; but during the summer he returned, and spent several weeks with his family in Rochester, N.Y. Business called him back again about the 1st of Sept., and he remarked as he left the door of his residence, that he should be absent only two or three weeks; and therefore his [family] were looking anxiously for his arrival when they received a letter informing them of a severe attack of sickness—and then came a telegraphic dispatch that he had died of cholera. His remains arrived in Rochester on the 21st, and were deposited in Mt. Hope. A funeral service was preached in the Universalist church on Sunday the 24th, when many of the [family] were present, including the mother, over eighty years old. This was the first death that has occurred in her large family for thirty years. He was very resigned and calm in his last hours, and died in full faith of future universal holiness and joy. The wife and a large circle of friends left behind do not mourn without hope.
