MRS. JENNIE ABRAMS HEATH

Mrs. Jennie Abrams Heath, 79, died at her home, 44 Borden Avenue Friday morning, January 6, after an illness of several weeks. The funeral services were held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday in the home, Rev. Clifford Bristow of the Baptists church officiating, assisted by Rev. Julia Tobey of the Universalist Church. John D. Rudgers sang, "The City Four Square," accompanied by Mrs. L.G. Stainton, pianist. Burial was in Hope cemetery by the side of Mr. Abrams.

Jennie Olin was born on the Leicester road, November 7, 1859, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Olin. In 1877 she was united in marriage to George Abrams. After a time passed with his parents in the Sucker Brook neighborhood, they moved to Salem, Oregon, returning to Perry about 45 years ago.

Here they built their pleasant home in Borden Avenue, where he died April 25, 1904. Later the widow married Adelbert Heath, who died in 1931.

Mrs. Heath was a woman who took great joy and pride in her home and garden, and during the summer months the surroundings of her home reflected the patience and work bestowed upon it by the owner.

Mrs. Heath was a member of the Universalist Church.

During the past two weeks she had been cared for by Miss Velma Hakes of Sherburne.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. Roxalany Olin Holcomb of Vesper, Wis.; a niece, Mrs. Florence Johnson, Pottersville, Mich.; two nephews, Cecil Olin of Lansing, Mich., and Dr. Olin Holcomb of Kokomo, Ind.
