Death Follows Period of Illness Covering Three Years

Mrs. Sarah A. Heath, the widow of the late Luther E. Heath, passed away last evening at 10:45 o'clock at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. C. F. Mason of 80 Lincoln-ave., with whom she has made her home since 1895.

A period of over three years embraces the duration of her illness which was characterized by the remarkable patience and fortitude of the deceased. The immediate cause of the death as attributed to pneumonia.

Mrs. Heath was the only child of the late Reuben and Mary Ann Keough Kinning. She was born in the town of Cuyler, but spent her earlier life in the town of Truxton.
