Mrs. Oliver Henry Dead

Clifton Springs, Feb. 25—Word has been received in this village of the death of Mrs. Harriet Hill Henry, wife of Oliver Hilliard Henry, which occurred at her home in Abilene, Kansas, on February 18th. Mrs. Henry was born near this village on July 19, 1818. In her early married life she united with the Universalist church at Clifton Springs. Later her husband and herself and family moved to Alabama where Mr. Henry died. Soon after his death her oldest son went to Abilene and the next year the rest followed. Mrs. Henry built the first frame dwelling house in Abilene and was closely identified with all the early history of the city and lived to see it grow from a little cluster of log cabins and dugouts to its present size. She is survived by three of her six children: T. C. Henry of Denver, Col.; Stuart Henry, of New York City, and Mrs. J. B. Warfield, with whom she lived. Mrs. Henry was ninety years and seven months old.
