DEATH OF MRS. J. W. HEWITT AT THE ADVANCED AGE OF EIGHTY YEARS. Had Lived in Friendship for Two Score Years.

On Friday morning last at 12:10, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. A. G. Hinman, occurred the death of Mrs. J. W. Hewitt, at the advanced age of 80 years.

Mrs. Adeline Paine Hewitt was born in St. Lawrence county, N.Y., in the year 1827. She was the daughter of the late Lewis Paine, who was a Universalist minister here, and a very earnest worker for many years. His remains now lie in Mt. Hope cemetery.

In 1845 she was married to Mr. J. W. Hewitt, and five children were born to them: Dr. W. I. Hewitt, of Olean, Elmer E., in the west, Gracia M., who died in 1888, Edgar A., and Mrs. A. G. Hinman, of Friendship.

Mrs. Hewitt had resided in Friendship for over 40 years. She was a very earnest worker in the Universalist church, and had always, until she was unable to attend, taken part in the music.

She had been in feeble health for some time, and for the last few weeks was confined to her bed.

After a long, busy and useful life she died as she had lived—honored, trusted and loved. She reared her own monument while she lived, in the hearts of all who knew her. Her life was completed, if work all done and well done constitutes completion.

The funeral was held at the house Sunday at three o'clock, Rev. G. W. Raeburn officiating. Burial at Mount Hope cemetery. Among those from out of town were Mr. and Mrs. W. I. Hewitt, Olean; Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Hinman, and Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Adams, Belmont.
