MRS. FLORENCE HALE HILL PASSES AWAY AT HERMON
KIDNEY TROUBLE AND HEART DISEASE PROVE FATAL TO NATIVE OF PIERREPONT

Hermon, Jan. 4.—Mrs. Florence Hale Hill, aged 42 years, 4 months and 15 days, died at her home on the Marshville road about a mile from the village of Hermon this morning at 1. She had been in ill health for about six months. It is believed that death was due to kidney trouble and heart trouble. Mrs. Hill was born in Pierrepont, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey J. Hale. She had lived in this vicinity practically all of her life. For many years she had been a teacher at various district schools in the vicinity. She married Bert J. Hill of Hermon many years ago and since their marriage they resided on a farm near Hermon.

She was well known in this village and took an active part in community affairs. She was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, No. 108 and of the Hermon Grange, No. 886.

Surviving are her husband, Bert J. Hill; her father, Harvey J. Hale, and one sister, Mrs. Iva Ayers of Pierrepont.

The funeral will be held from her late home on Sunday afternoon at 2. Rev. H. [Herbert] P. Morrell [Universalist], a member of the faculty of the theological school of St. Lawrence university at Canton, will officiate. Burial will be made in the Hermon cemetery.
