DEATH WAS SUDDEN

Roland W. Hill Stricken With Hemorrhages

Roland W. Hill was stricken with hemorrhages at 7 o'clock yesterday morning and died an hour and a half later at the home of his father-in-law Dr. A. P. [Adam Percival] Burkhart, No. 4 Owasco Street. He was 29 years old and appeared in good health Saturday when he attended a baseball game.

When about to rise from bed Mr. Hill suffered a hemorrhage and Dr. B. B. Mack was hastily summoned. Before anything could be done, however, the man had expired.

Mr. Hill was a native of Warrensburg, Warren County. To prepare as a teacher he graduated from the Albany Normal School and for the year following was principal of an academy in Virginia. In 1911 he was principal of schools in Croton Falls, N.Y. In 1912 and '13 he filled the same office at Newcomb in Essex County. Last September he entered the University of Missouri with the intention of covering sufficient ground to place him in the second year of the State College of Agriculture at Cornell the coming Fall. While in college Mr. Hill was always an honor student.

His connection with Auburn began five years ago when he engaged in the insurance business with D. L. Tuller for one year. Just six years ago last Saturday Mr. Hill married a daughter [Vera] of Dr. A. P. Burkhart of Auburn. He was a member of the Auburn Lodge of Masons.

Surviving the young man are his wife; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ira Hill of Glens Falls; a daughter, Miss Virginia Hill of Auburn; a sister, Mrs. Henry L. Smith of Warrensburg, and two brothers, Frederick and William Hill, both of Des Moines, Iowa.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at the home of his father-in-law, Dr. A. P. Burkhart, No. 14 Owasco Street. Rev. A. [Arnold] S. Yantis, pastor of the First Universalist Church, will officiate. Burial will be made in Union Springs.
