In Potsdam, St. Lawrence Co., N.Y., Feb. 27th, 1857, of consumption, Mrs. Jane Hitchcock, wife of Horace Hitchcock, and daughter of Solomon and Philania Parmeter, aged 28 years and 8 months.—The subject of this notice was of more than ordinary talents and acquirements, possessing a mind of high toned thought and feelings amiable, and kind in disposition, she was highly esteemed by all who knew her. During her sickness, which was somewhat protracted, she manifested unusual fortitude and christian resignation to the will of her Heavenly Father, and at last fell sweetly asleep in Jesus, being full in the faith of the final reconciliation of all souls to God. She selected a text from Romans xiv:11, "For it is written, as I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God," from which a discourse was delivered on the Sunday following at the Universalist church at Potsdam by the Rev. U. M. Fisk of that place.
