Sternberg of Geneva, Mrs. Cora Hough, wife of Geo. Hough, formerly of Newark, now of Jersey city, and E. D. Hitchcock of Geneva. They are almost prostrated with grief, particularly Mrs. Hough, who had made the declining days of her mother so easy and pleasant, and they have they sympathy of many friends.
