Death of Mrs. B. H. Hollister

Mrs. Benjamin B. Hollister, who has been in failing health for several years past, died last Friday evening at her home on Covington street, aged 72 years, 7 months.

Alice D. Mackin was the daughter of Joseph and Olive Mackin and was born at Wellsville, N.Y. She was one of a family of seven children—six sons and one daughter. She grew to womanhood in Wellsville, where on Feb. 25th, 1867, she was united in marriage to Benjamin H. Hollister of Perry and came here to reside with him on the homestead farm. They removed to this village in 1883 and have resided here since that time. Only about a year ago an attractive new bungalow, equipped with all modern conveniences, was completed for their home on Covington street by her devoted husband, removing to it from the home built several years ago on Grove street, which they sold.

Mrs. Hollister was a member of the Universalist Church of Perry and a consistent Christian. Poor health for many years prevented her from taking an active part in the work of the church she loved and deprived her of other opportunities for service, which it was naturally her disposition to render.

Funeral services were held last Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock at her late residence, conducted by her minister, Rev. Clara Morgan, with interment at Hope Cemetery.

Besides her husband she is survived by their only son, Walter D., of this place; also by three brothers, viz: Dr. Merritt Mackin and Frank Mackin of Wellsville; and Edwin Mackin of Kirkwood, Mo.
