DEATHS.

In Frankfort, Herkimer county, on the 19th ult., of quick consumption, Mrs. HARRIET A., wife of Wm. B. Holmes, Esg., and daughter of Col. Henry Hearsey, formerly of Waterville, now of Cazenovia, N.Y., aged 30 years. The subject of this notice was possessed of a highly cultivated mind, polished manners, and an amiable disposition. Tho' aware of her approaching dissolution, for her, death had no terrors-strong and unwavering in the faith of a crucified and risen Redeemer and a world's Saviour, she knew in whom she had put her trust, talked composedly and resignedly of her exit from life, left a kind word and a farewell memorial to all her kindred and friends, selected the text from which her funeral sermon should be preached, (Eccl. xii:1,) named the preacher who should deliver it (the writer of this notice,) and sweetly fell asleep in Jesus, "calm and unruffled as a summer's sea when not a breath of air flies o'er its surface."
