Homrighaus Funeral Rites Set Saturday

Dolgeville—Funeral services for Andrew J. Homrighaus, 67, of 6 Beaver St., who was injured fatally in an automobile crash hear Poland late Tuesday night, will be at 2 Saturday from the Jacobsen Funeral Home with the Rev. Maurice Cobb, Universalist minister, officiating.

Burial will be in Dolgeville Cemetery.

Mr. Homrighaus was killed when the car in which he was riding, driven by a friend, William Near, 50, of 6 Wolf St., crashed into the bridge that spans West Canada Creek near Routes 8 and 28.

Homrighaus was the owner of the A & H Garage, Ford dealers, in Dolgeville. Near is a mechanic employed there. Near is now confined in St. Elizabeth Hospital, Utica.

The men had gone to the Homrighaus camp at Beaver River earlier Tuesday night to get a lighting generator, Trooper Donald Pearson of the State Police was told. They were returning home.

Mr. Homrighaus was born in the Town of Salisbury, son of John and Mary Narbinger Homrighaus. He married Ruth Fish in 1923 in Dolgeville. He was a member of the Little Falls Elks Lodge, Sprite Game Club, American Legion, Eagle Falls Hunting Club and other groups.

He was the first Dolgeville man to enlist for service in World War I. He served in France.

Besides his wife, he leaves two brothers, Merle Homrighaus, Dolgeville, and Edward Homrighaus, Stratford.
