Body Arrives Today

The body of Sgt. Frank Homrighaus of the Town of Salisbury will be brought to his home Monday afternoon by hearse from Schenectady. St. Homrighaus, who enlisted April 27, 1942 was wounded on May 16, 1944 in Italy and died on May 18. He was commander of a tank and at the time he was wounded, was engaged in mopping up operations behind the lines, having taken part in the Sicilian invasion. He was the holder of the Purple Heart and the Silver Star.

Sgt. Romrighaus was born February 25, 1920 in the town of Salisbury, the son of George and the late Cora Doxtader Homrighaus. He was a graduate of the Dolgeville high school, class of 1940, a member of the Salisbury Center Fire department, the Universalist church and Sunday school of Salisbury Center. At the time of his enlistment, he was employed at the Cherry-Burrell Corp. in Little Falls.

The survivors are the father and one brother, Linford, of the Dutchtown section of the Town of Salisbury, several aunts and uncles.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 at the home. Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton will officiate. Burial will be made in the Tuttle cemetery in Salisbury Center.

Members of the American Legion are requested to meet at the Moore funeral home at 1 Monday afternoon for the purpose of accompanying the body to the home.
