In Riga, April 25, Mrs. EMELINE HOPKINS, aged 19 years. In the Ambassador of March 24 is the following—"Married, Feb. 22, by Rev. W. McNeal, Mr. LeRay De Chaumont Hopkins, of Cortlandville, N.Y. to Miss Emeline Tullar of Riga, N.Y." The young, pure and amiable Miss T. whose marriage was thus published, has, after a wedded life of two months and three days, closed her eyes to things temporal, to open them to things eternal... Her disease was consumption. One day and a half before her change [death], she was out cultivating a flower bed, thinking perhaps she might linger to see the seeds put forth and unfold their leaves to her admiring gaze. But she has been called to a more beautiful flower garden, and to a more salubrious and fragrant atmosphere... The funeral was attended on the 27th in the Methodist meeting house at North Chili.
