JAMES B. HOPKINS DEAD

James B. Hopkins, a Brooklynite for three-quarters of a century, died yesterday at his residence, 677 Jefferson avenue, aged 83 years. He was born in Maryland and came to this city when quite young. For over 60 years he has been in the sail-making business. He was connected for many years with the firm of S. S. Thorpe & Co., and of late years has been associated with his two sons, Samuel and John, in the concern of John P. Hopkins. His son William is superintendent of Station C of the Brooklyn Post Office. Mr. Hopkins was a prominent member of All Souls' Universalist Church, in the Eastern District. He was a man of sterling character and was well liked by a host of friends. Three sons survive him. The funeral services will be held to-morrow evening from his house.
