Death of Michael P. Hoskins

Michael P. Hoskins, who served throughout the Civil War as bugler for Company K, Forty-fourth New York Volunteer Infantry, died yesterday at his home, No. 78 Genesee Street, after a brief illness. Upon his return to this city after the war Mr. Hoskins was employed at Casey's Tool Factory, where he remained for nearly 20 years. Lately he had been connected with J. B. Stupp in his storage warehouse business in Market Street.

Mr. Hoskins is survived by his wife and three children, two sons and one daughter. The children all reside in Chicago. The funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Tallman-Walker undertaking rooms in Clark Street. Seward-Crocker Post will conduct G.A.R. services under the direction of Commander John J. Woodall. Rev. Arnold S. Yantis of the First Universalist Church will officiate. Interment will be made at Fort Hill.
