Service Here Today For T. H. Howe, 65, Born Here  
Rochester Native, Late of Chicago Realty Firm, Was Bank Organizer

Funeral services for Thaddeus H. Howe, 65, a native of Rochester, will take place at the grave in the Howe family lot at Mount Hope Cemetery this morning at 9:30 o'clock, immediately after the arrival of the body from Chicago, where Mr. Howe lived during the last 35 years of his life.

Rev. C. C. [Charles Clare] Blauvelt, minister of the First Universalist Church, will officiate. The body of Mrs. Laura [Lora] Belle Wolever Howe of Chicago, who died four years ago, is being brought to Rochester to be placed in the Howe family lot with that of her husband.

Mr. Howe was born in Rochester, the son of Harley J. and Mary W. Howe. His father was a prominent scale manufacturer. Mr. Howe attended School 14 and the Rochester Free Academy and after his graduation conducted a branch office of his father's business in Boston. Later he traveled for the Kimball Tobacco Company, after which he went to Chicago, where he was an organizer of the Colony Bank, of which he was president for a time. In recent years he was engaged in the real estate business.

For 47 years, Mr. Howe was a member of the Achilles Military Corps of Rochester. He was a thirty-second degree Mason, a charter member of the Chicago Athletic Club and of the South Shore Club of Chicago.

He leaves two daughters, Mrs. Clinton Robinson and Mrs. Cecil Francis, of Chicago; two sisters, Mrs. Edward Oliver Graham, (?3) Rutgers Street and Mrs. Anson Malcolm [Inez] Lord of 12 Thayer Street; three nieces, Mrs. Dexter Perkins and Miss Inez Graham of Rochester, and Mrs. Julius Kaelder of Philadelphia, and a nephew, W. [William] Howe Kiefer of Rochester.
