MR. AND MRS. AUGUSTUS HOWLAND

On Sunday occurred the double funeral of Mr. and Mrs. Augustus Howland at Kirkville. There was one service for both which occurred at the Universalist Church and was largely attended. Rev. J.C.F. Grumbine of Syracuse preached a discourse upon "Truth" which was listened to attentively. The singing was furnished by Mrs. Ella Smith and Miss Mary Gregg, assisted by Messrs. Lafayette Moore and Floyd Palmer. A sheaf of wheat crossed by a cycle bearing the word "Rest" was placed upon Mr. Howland's casket, while a beautiful wreath of flowers and a bouquet of calla lilies were upon the casket of Mrs. Howland. The interment for both was made in this cemetery.

Mr. Howland was born at New Bedford, Conn., January 17, 1811, being in his 77th year. His wife, Mrs. Lucinda A. Judd, was born at Waynestead, Conn., January 2, 1822, being in the 66th year of her age. Mrs. Howland died March 17th, of "Strangulated Femoral Hernia," after an illness of only six days. Mr. Howland died twenty-four hours later of "Catarrhal Pneumonia," he having been ill but a few days. Mr. Howland occupied for many years the position of Banker at Auburn. Since his retirement from business he has spent most of his life in Syracuse, having been for the past three or four years an invalid. While afflicted in this way he has been under the immediate care of his wife who was untiring in her watchfulness and devotion of him, and during her sickness she expressed great anxiety lest he should be neglected and not receive his customary attention. By the former marriage of Mr. Howland there still survive him, three sons and two daughters. At the funeral were present two of the sons of Aurora, N.Y., and a daughter, Mrs. Jane Taber of New Bedford, Conn.

Mr. and Mrs. David A. Tarbell of Bridgeport, Conn., relatives of Mrs. Howland, and a life-long friend, Mrs. McManus, of Troy, were also present.
