CHAS. HOWLAND AGED 80, DIES AT PAMELIA HOME
Grandfather Was Early Settler in This Section, Coming Here With Ox Team

Charles Byron Howland, aged 80 years, life long resident of the town of Pamela, died at the Howland Homestead near Calcium, about 7 o'clock this morning following a week's illness of pneumonia. He was born in the town of Pamela, April 27, 1844, son of the late Hiram and Emaline Cole Howland. He had resided on the Howland Homestead all his life. He retired from active work several years ago, but maintained his residence on the farm.

His grandfather William Howland was a pioneer settler of this section, coming here from Massachusetts with his family and ox team in the year of 1802.

On September 29, 1891, he married Miss Jennie Blanc of Watertown, who died August 28, 1911.

No near relatives survive although several cousins reside in this section.

Funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the farm near Calcium. Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, D.D., pastor of the All Soul's Universalist church, will officiate. Interment will be made in the Sanford Corners cemetery.
