Harry H. Husted Dies in Hospital

Harry H. Husted, 69, whose father, the late George F. [P.] Husted, operated the Husted studio galleries in Mannsville, Adams and Sandy Creek, died in the House of the Good Samaritan, Watertown, early Friday morning, November 30, 1951 following an operation.

He was born in March 1882 in Mannsville, the younger of two sons of the late George P. and May Young Husted. The early part of his life was spent in Mannsville, Adams and Sandy Creek, communities in which his father operated the Husted Galleries. He was educated in Sandy Creek schools.

As a young man Mr. Husted became a traveling salesman for a roofing company. In early life he moved from Sandy Creek to Watertown, where he had since resided. More than 35 years ago he became associated with the Aetna Life Insurance company as its district manager in the Watertown area, a position which he held until a few years ago. In recent years he conducted an antique shop in Watertown with Mrs. Grace K. Hayes.

Mr. Husted was married about 1911 to Miss Harriet S. Hopkins of Watertown, her death occurring February 27, 1920. In March, 1921 he married Mrs. Pearl Walch Whitredge of Pulaski. She died August 18, 1939 and since that time he had resided at the home of Mr. and Mrs. James V. Cleveland of Watertown.

Surviving Mr. Husted are two nieces, Mrs. Charles L. (Florence Husted) Draper of Watertown and Mrs. William G. (Helen Husted) Huggins of Carthage, and a nephew, Richard S. Husted, Englewood, N. J. His brother, Herbert Husted, died January 12, 1944.

The funeral was held in Watertown Monday afternoon with the Rev. Dr. Harold H. Niles, pastor of All Souls Universalist church, officiating. Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery, Sandy Creek.
