Death Claims A. J. Hungerford

The death of J. Arthur Hungerford, for years a well known local and Central New York roofing contractor, occurred shortly after 1 o'clock this afternoon at his home, 131 North Fulton Street. Mr. Hungerford had been in failing health for some time. Mr. Hungerford conducted a roofing and tinsmith shop at 21 Wall Street for many years.

Surviving besides his wife is one daughter, Mrs. Donald Smith of Union Springs; four sons, Ralph, William, Edwin and Kenneth Hungerford, all of this city; his mother, Mrs. Edwin Hungerford of Syracuse; three brothers, Edwin, William and Leonard Hungerford, also of Syracuse; five sisters, Mrs. William Wagner of East Syracuse; Mrs. Edwin Masen, Mrs. William Mastin of Syracuse, Mrs. Charles Sunderlin of Rochester and Mrs. Carl Craig of Cleveland, O.

Mr. Hungerford was a member of the Elks, Modern Woodmen of America and St. Paul's Lodge of Masons. He was a communicant of the Universalist Church.
