## EUGENE M. HUNNEWELL

Eugene M. Hunnewell, after a long and tedious illness, entered into eternal rest at 9:45 p.m. Thursday, August 31, at Middletown, N.Y. Mr. Hunnewell was born in this city, December 24, 1851, the eldest son of Charles H. and Olive Pinkham Hunnewell. He received his education in the public schools of this city, and at the age of 17 he began learning the trade of book binding. At the age of twenty-one he was persuaded to lay aside his trade for a time and entered the employ of the government as one of the first letter carriers of Cambridge. At the end of seven years he again returned to his trade, at which he has since been employed, having spent nearly seventeen years in the employ of the Middletown book bindery. Mr. Hunnewell was devoted to his home life, where he was usually to be found outside of business hours. [On] September 14, 1888, Mr. Hunnewell was united in marriage to Gertrude, eldest daughter of Silas R. and Mary E. Palmer, of Honesdale, Pa. Besides his wife, Mr. Hunnewell is survived by three sisters and one brother: Alice G., of this city; Flora A., of Woonsocket, R. I.; Ella F., wife of W. W. Conant, of Arlington, and Charles H. M., of West Somerville.

Mr. Hunnewell was a member of Christ Universalist church [Christ Church, Universalist] of Middletown; also a charter member of Brandon lodge, No. 1007, I.O.O.F., of Williamsport, Pa. The funeral services were held at the late home, 3 New street, Middletown, Monday, September 4. Interment was in Wallkill cemetery.
