HURLBUT RITES SET TOMORROW

Native of Pennsylvania Descendant of Early N.E. Settlers

Funeral services for Francis L. Hurlbut, 71, who died suddenly Sunday will be conducted from his late residence, 21 Lee avenue, tomorrow night at 8 o'clock by Rev. John E. Wood, pastor of Floral Park Universalist church.

Mr. Hurlbut was born in Pennsylvania in 1874 and in 1881 his family moved to Elmira, where he was educated and spent his early manhood.

He worked on the New York barge canal for several years before being employed by the Brooklyn water works. He was later transferred to the typographical bureau of the borough of Queens, where he was engineer in charge of drafting, until his retirement 11 years ago.

Mr. Hurlbut was a member of the Brooklyn Association of Engineers, the Massapequa lodge of Masons and the Floral Park Universalist church.

His ancestors came to the United States in 1635 with the Sir Lion Gardner expedition and settled in New England.

He is survived by his wife, Julia Hurlbut, of Rockville Centre; a son, Lyman Hurlbut; a granddaughter, Julia Louise Hurlbut; and a great grandson, Donald Lee Hurlbut, all of Valley Stream.
