Frank Hurlbutt, a life-long and highly esteemed farmer of Pittsfield, passed away in the Parshall Hospital at Oneonta Tuesday afternoon, October 27th, aged seventy-four years. He had been a patient in the hospital for three weeks and on Tuesday morning underwent a serious operation. The body was removed to Sloan's funeral home in Morris from which place the funeral was held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. F. G. Leonard, pastor of the Universalist church having charge of the services. The remains were borne to its [sic] resting place in Hillington cemetery by four grandsons, Leo and Frederick Hurlbutt, Howard and Harry Brown. Mr. Hurlbutt was born in the town of Pittsfield July 12, 1862, a son of Samuel and Lucinda (Shumack) Hurlbutt. He married Janie Smith, also of Pittsfield, fifty-four years ago. Their entire life was spent on a farm in that vicinity. Mrs. Hurlbutt died twenty-four years ago.

Surviving him are three sons, Carl and William Hurlbutt, residing on a farm near-by and Charles Hurlbutt with whom he had lived for several years; one daughter, Mrs. Clayton Brown of Randallsville; one sister, Mrs. Alfred Hunter of Pittsfield; five grandsons and one granddaughter and a wide circle of friends who unite with the family in their sorrow.
