In Marathon, Cort. [Cortland] co., Br. LEWIS HYATT, aged 57 years, after a long and distressing illness of more than a year. Indeed, I was informed by his family that he had been unwell, more or less, for ten years, so much so, that he has been unable to attend to the necessary duties of life. Br. Hyatt received a Letter of Fellowship from the Chenango Association [of Universalists] a number of years since, but owing to the circumstances under which he has been placed, he has devoted but little of his time to the ministry. I think Br. H. was not understood in some of his views. It was a subject that caused him much sorrow during his last days, the he should be so misunderstood. He was strong in the faith of a world's purification, eventually, through the means which God had appointed. We would wait patiently for the future world to reveal more clearly the intricacies of mind, trusting that when the problem is solved, our charities will be more extended for all of our race.
