DEATHS.

In Pharsalia, Aug, 15th, Mrs. PHEBE, wife of Mr. Ambrose Hyde, aged 76 years. In the same place, Aug. 25th, Mr. AMBROSE HYDE, aged 85 years. The indisposition of the former was short and severe, that of the latter protracted and painful. Industrious in their habits, exemplary in their deportment, pure in their morals, charitable in their feelings, benevolent in their gifts, and christian-like in their walk and conversation, they secured the esteem of all around them and adorned the doctrine of their Saviour in all things by well ordered lives. They lived together for a great number of years, during the whole or principal portion of which time, they rejoiced in and were together blessed by the same glorious faith, that 'God will have all men to be saved and come unto the knowledge of the truth.' A very brief period intervenes, and both have testified to its sustaining and triumphant power in the hour of death, and their bodies slumber together in the same cold and silent resting place, and their spirits together share the joys of a better world, where they 'are as angels of God in Heaven.' The condition of Mr. H. would admit of no religious services at the burial of his wife, and Aug. 27th, at his interment, a funeral discourse for both was delivered in the Presbyterian meeting house at Pharsalia centre, to a very large audience of relatives, friends and neighbors, by Rev. J. T. [John Temple] Goodrich.—Oxford Republican of Sept. 8th [1847].
