—Newell B. Hyde, a former well-known resident of Utica, passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. L. M. Casler in Buffalo, Tuesday, after a long period of ill-health. Born 74 years ago near Jordanville the deceased spent his youth there and when a young man came to Utica to live. For a long time he conducted a cigar, candy and news store at the corner of Genesee and Bleecker streets. for 20 years he was a valued employe[e] of J. B. Wells & Son Company's store. Upon the death of his wife four years ago he retired and since then had been living with his daughter in Buffalo. Mr. Hyde was especially well known on Corn Hill, having resided for many years on Seymour avenue. By all who had his acquaintance he was held in the highest esteem and his death brought sorrow to many old friends in Utica. Mr. Hyde was a member of the Church of the Reconciliation [Universalist] in this city and had been superintendent of the Sunday school of that church and director of the choir. He was one of the charter members of Fort Schuyler Council, Royal Arcanum. He leaves one daughter, Mrs. L. M. Casler, of Buffalo. The remains were brought to this city and were interred in the family plot at Forest Hill Cemetery.
