RITES TUESDAY FOR VICTIM OF CRASH ON HILL Clarence Isengard, Shoe Machinery Salesman, Dies 10 Days After Lung Is Punctured in Accident

Injuries suffered on the night of March 29, when the motor car he was driving left the highway near Brady Hill on the Auburn-Skaneateles Road, proved fatal to Clarence Isengard, 43, of Dolgeville, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Isengard, 114 Owasco Street. Mr. Isengard died early Sunday morning at Auburn City Hospital, where he was taken after the accident.

Mr. Isengard, an employe [sic] of the United States Shoe Machinery Company, stationed at Dolgeville, where he had been making his home temporarily, was driving alone on a visit to his parents in this city when the fatal accident happened. His car struck the rear of an automobile driven by Andrew Rodak, Jr., of Skaneateles Falls and caroomed off the road, striking a culvert.

Mr. Isengard was thrown forward by the force of the collision with the culvert wall and the gear shift lever penetrated his right side and punctured his right lung. Two ribs were broken and he also suffered a deep gash over his right eye.

Born in Auburn, Mr. Isengard had been a resident of this city most of his life. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Grace Timmerman of Dolgeville, Herkimer County; one son, Stanley Isengard of Binghamton; and one brother, William Isengard of Oakwood. The body was removed by Joseph E. Heieck, undertaker, to the home of Mr. Isengard's parents, where funeral services will be held at 2:30 Tuesday afternoon. Burial will be in Fort Hill Cemetery. Rev. Plato T. Jones, acting pastor of First Universalist Church, will officiate.
