SHOE COMPANY WORKER DIES Mrs. Grace Isengard Taken at Dolgeville; Funeral Today

Dolgeville—Mrs. Grace Austin Isengard passed away at home in the Gennis block on (?) street in this village Sunday, evening [Aug. 16, 1936] at about 9. She had been ill for the past four years but only critically ill for the past four days. Death was due to heart trouble.

She was born in Youkers Bush, in the Town of Oppenheim, April 2, 1892 and was the daughter of John Timmerman and Julia Hayes Timmerman. When a little girl she lived in the town of Fairfield, but the most of her life has been spent in this village. She was twice married. Her first husband, Lynn Austin died in 1930 and her second husband, Clarence Insegard, died in April 1935.

She had been employed in the Daniel Green Felt Shoe Company in this village for the past twenty-five years and had received a service pin from that company for her faithful and loyal service. She was a member of the Rebecca [Rebekah] Lodge in this village and was a past Noble Grand.

She is survived by two brothers, William Timmerman of this village, and Eri Timmerman of Richfield Springs; three sisters, Mrs. Minnie Quackenbush of Little Falls, Mrs. Milo Smith of [Newville], and Mrs. Lynn Parse of Little Falls; and several nieces and nephews.

The funeral will be held from the home this afternoon at 2 and at 2:30 from the Universalist church with the Rebecca lodge having charge of the service. Burial will be made in the Dolgeville cemetery. [She is buried as Grace Austin].
