DEATH AT MACEDON OF ADELBERT L. JACKSON

Macedon, Sept. 19.—Adelbert L. Jackson, a resident of this village, passed away at his home at 7:30 o'clock Tuesday evening, September 12th, following many weeks of failing health. He was born in Barre [Orleans Co.], N.Y., July 30, 1844, and was the son of Ralph Jackson and Mary Greene Jackson. In the spring of 1862, he enlisted in the Civil War, serving three years a member of 151st Regiment, New York Volunteers, Company D. [On] March 21, 1866, he was united in marriage with Miss Charlotte S. Gardner of Farmington [Ontario Co.], and many years of their wedded life were passed in this town. Mr. Jackson was an interested member of the Universalist church, holding the office of deacon and chairman of the board of trustees at the time of his death. He was also a member of the local lodge of Masons and commander of the George S. Bradley Post, G.A.R. He leaves his wife, Charlotte Gardner Jackson of Macedon; one daughter, Mrs. Samuel G. Ayres of Woonsocket, R.I.; four grandchildren, Charlotte and Gilbert Ayres of Woonsocket, and Velda and May Ward Waterman of Williamson; one sister, Mrs. Benjamin Kitson of Ionia, Mich., and two brothers, Reuben Jackson of Knowlesville, and A. H. Jackson of Ionia, Mich. The funeral was held from the Universalist church, Friday. Rev. Adelbert E. Allison and Dr. S. A. Ayres of Woonsocket, R.I., conducted the service. Burial was made in Farmington cemetery.
