Farmington, June 15—Mrs. Charlotte Susan Jackson died last week Saturday morning at an early hour after a long illness, at the home of her brother, Charles H. Gardner, in this village. She was the daughter of John Wilkinson Gardner and Emma B. Cotton Gardner and was born in this town on February 13, 1845, and was 80 years of age. She had resided in this town and Macedon all her life. She is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Minnie Jackson Ayers, wife of Rev. Samuel Ayers of Boston, Mass., and four grandchildren, Miss Charlotte Ayers and Gilbert Ayers, of Boston, Miss Valeda Waterman and Maynard Waterman, of Williamson; also one sister, Mrs. A. E. Markham of this town, and three brothers, Leonard of Walworth, and Edwin and Charles of this town. Mrs. Jackson was a member of the Eastern Star at Macedon and a member and active worker in the Universalist church at Macedon when able to attend. She bore her long illness with remarkable fortitude, always cheerful, and grateful for the kind care which has been given her by her brother and wife. Funeral services were held from the home of her brother, Charles H. Gardner, on Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock. Rev. George W. Porter, pastor of the Universalist church at Macedon, officiated and interment was made in the North Farmington cemetery.
