DEATH CLAIMS HENRY JACKSON Resident of Middleville Ill Only Few Days

Middleville, Oct. 11—Henry Eugene Jackson, one of Middleville's most prominent citizens, died at his home this afternoon after an illness of a few days with pneumonia and heart disease. Mr. Jackson spent last weekend at his summer home, Morehouse Lake, and was in his usual good health. Monday he was taken ill.

He was born June 14, 1857, son of the late Andrew and Mary Jackson. He had spent his entire life in this village. [On] October 12, 1880, Mr. Jackson married Emma Mosher, who died March (9?), 1924. Mr. Jackson united with the Universalist Church March 31, 1907, and had always been an active member. He served as president of the board of trustees for many years. He was a member of the Newport Lodge (4??), F.& A.M., Morehouse Lake Club, Chamber of Commerce and Middleville Cemetery Association. In politics he was a stout Democrat. He was associated with his father-in-law, W.W. Mosher, in the general store business for many years. Later he purchased Mr. Mosher's interest. Two years ago he retired, selling to his son-in-law, George J. Casler.

Mr. Casler leaves a daughter, Mrs. George J. [Mary] Casler; one son, Earl M.; two brothers, Irving E., this village, and Deville G. Jackson, Hood River, Ore., and four grandchildren, Hilda, Jack and Margaret Casler and James Eugene Jackson.

Funeral will be held Monday at 2:30 p.m. from the home, Rev. W.H. [Wines Harris] Skeels officiating. Masonic services will be conducted at the grave.
