W. W. Jackson, 74, Herkimer, Dies

Herkimer—William W. Jackson, 74, well known dental mechanic, died Sunday morning at his home at 118 North Prospect Street following a long illness from complications.

He was born March 10, 1860, at Fairfield, the son of Washington and Helen Taber Jackson. His early education was received in Fairfield and Middleville. He later studied in Washington, D.C. He first engaged in practice of his profession in Syracuse and came to Herkimer in 1917, where he had lived since. He had been connected with Dr. W. G. Murray.

[On] June 28, (1911?) he married Iva D. Uhle, Little Falls, who with their son, William, survive. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. Nettie Christ, Middleville; a brother, Howard Jackson, Palmyra, and a nephew, Everett B. Christ, Dolgeville.

Mr. Jackson served as deputy sheriff under Sheriffs William H. Cross and George Firth. He was in charge of the juries during the famous Werner and Warder trials. He was a member of the O.U.A.M. and the Middleville Universalist Church.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 from the First Universalist Church, with burial in Oak Hill.
