Orville Jacobson, proprietor of the Monticello House, this village, died Wednesday, Apr. 20, aged 56 years. Deceased was born in Columbia and was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Abram Jacobson, who for many years conducted the hotel here. He was a man of genial disposition, and was well liked in the community. The funeral was held Sunday at 1 o'clock p.m. at the hotel, Rev. C. H. [Charles Henry] Vail of Richfield Springs [Universalist] officiating. A number of floral pieces surrounded the casket, being the gifts of friends and neighbors. The bearers were neighboring hotel men, Geo. W. Green, Starr Kelter, William Cross, Wellington Zoller, Henry Dyer and Elmer Ayres. The large concourse of friends and neighbors that attended the funeral and followed the remains to their last resting place, showed the esteem in which he was held by the community. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Alice [Willmarth] Jacobson and twin sister, Mrs. Orpha Wollaber of Elizabethtown, N.Y. The sympathy of the neighborhood is extended to Mrs. Jacobson in this her sad bereavement.
