MRS. EDWIN M. JARVIS

The death of Lena H. Lindsay, wife of Edwin M. Jarvis, which occurred at her home near Fly Creek, Thursday morning, October 9th, as the result of a complication of diseases removes one of the beloved citizens of that locality who will be mourned by a large circle of friends.
