The death on Saturday, July 30, of Mrs. Sarah A. Jarvis removes from Brooklyn an old resident widely known in charitable and women's club work, and endeared to a large circle of friends all over the borough. In the Eastern District Mrs. Jarvis' loss will be particularly felt, and church and women's club circles will miss one of their most active members, she having made her home in that section of the city for over fifty years.

The deceased was a member of the Portia, Motley and Chiropean clubs, and also of the National Society of New England Women. She was prominently identified with All Souls Universalist Church, on South Tenth street, having been actively associated with the founding of both the church and Sunday school, and one of the superintendents of the latter for many years. For some years past she had been associated with the Memorial Hospital for Women and Children.

Mrs. Jarvis was born in Exeter, N.H., on March 10, 1839. In 1844 she removed to Williamsburg, and in 1851 her marriage to Dr. Aaron Jarvis took place. Her death occurred after a long illness at her residence, 187 Hancock street.
