## Albert E. Johnson

Albert E. Johnson, son of Mrs. Harriet Johnson, of this village, died Saturday afternoon, May 11, 1908, at the Hahnemann hospital in Rochester. He had been suffering with a stomach difficulty for a long time, in fact was dangerously ill several months ago, but got better and resumed work.

He was again taken ill on Saturday, May 4, and an operation for ulcers of the stomach was performed at the above named hospital on Thursday last. He came out from the operation and hopes were entertained for his recovery, but in his weakened condition chances were against him, and on Saturday at about 1 o'clock he passed away.

His sister, Mrs. W. P. Shanley, of this place, was present at the operation, and his brother, Harry Johnson of Rochester, and friend, Miss Grace Bulkley of Savona were at his bedside when he died.

Deceased was born in Cohocton, March 19, 1880, and the greater part of his life had been spent here. After leaving the High school he learned the printer's trade in the office of the Times-Index. He became a good workman, and at the time of his last sickness was employed by the John P. Smith Printing Co., of Rochester.

He leaves beside his mother, one sister, Mrs. Wm. P. Shanley of this place, and four brothers, Carl of Buffalo, Harry of Rochester, Walter of Painted Post, and Hubert of this place.

The remains were brought to his home here and the funeral was held at the Universalist church at half past one Monday afternoon, Rev. Chas. E. Petty of Hornell conducting the services. Interment in Maple View cemetery.
