There survive her one daughter, who was with her and watched and waited upon her tenderly to the last, and two sons who reside in Dakota, also three sisters, Mrs. Caswell, Mrs. Cramer, Mrs. Britt, and one brother.

The funeral services over her mortal remains took place on Sunday at the home of Mrs. Caswell in Murray, the Rev. Thomas Borden, of Albion, [a Universalist] officiating. A large number of the friends and neighbors gathered to bear their testimony to the wide spread esteem in which she was held.
