Sudden Death

Everybody was shocked Sunday morning to learn that Mrs. Adensy Jones passed away very suddenly about nine o'clock Saturday evening at her home on Cryder Creek about two miles below the village.

She had seemingly be [been] in as good health as usual for some time past and made no complaints during the day. About twenty minutes before her death she went into her room and soon after called her daughter, Cora, who found her very ill. Mr. Frank Collver happened to be there and started immediately on his wheel for help; calling first at Jas. Higgins' and then coming to the village for Mrs. Jones' sons, Porter and John, but she expired before anyone could get there. The doctors pronounced it heart trouble.

Mrs. Jones was 60 years of age and was married November 27, 1859 to D. S. Jones, who died about 13 years ago. Her father, Calvin Wilson, was one of the pioneer settlers of this town and she was the youngest of a large family of which there now remains but one, Lorenzo Wilson who lives in the west part of town.

The funeral was held at the Universalist church Tuesday at ten o'clock, Rev. N. [Noel] E. Spicer conducting the services. Burial at the Baptist cemetery.

She was a lady honored and respected by all who knew her; very self sacrificing and always looking out for the welfare of her family. She leaves four children: Laport C., John J., Arch D. and Cora A., all of whom made their home with their mother at the homestead, although Arch D. is at present teaching at Dykeman, N.Y.

Of relatives from away who attended the funeral we note Will Wilson and family of Wellsville, and Charles Eaton and wife of Alfred.
