## SCHUYLER LAKE MRS. JOHN A. JONES

Our entire village was saddened on Sunday, January 11, when it learned of the death of Mrs. John A. Jones, which occurred at 5 a. m. that morning in the Bassett hospital, after 12 weeks of being ill in bed and several weeks prior to that of very poor health.

Angie V. Baker was born July 30, 1869 daughter of Henry J. and Angeline Duel Baker, and had always lived in the house where she was born.

[On] December 30, 1890 she married John A. Jones of this village.

All her life she had been a very active member of the Universalist church, and played the organ in the church for about 50 years. She was a talented musician and many have listened with rapture to her music, both in church and at home.

For many years she was a member of Arbutus Chapter, OES, at Richfield Springs, until compelled by ill health to withdraw.

She leaves besides her husband, several cousins. Mrs. Cora Miller of this place is one of them. Bert Lidell of Atlantic City is a nephew.

Her funeral, which was largely attended was held at her home on Wednesday, January 14, with the Rev. Harold Haynes of Richfield Springs officiating. The bearers were relatives of hers: Robert Jones of Oaksville, Dean Rathbun of Springfield, Earl Bevin of Clayille, Ashley Strong of this place.

Many beautiful flowers testified to the esteem in which Mrs. Jones was held in the hearts of the citizens.
