MRS. ALBERT G. JONES DIES AFTER ILLNESS Woman Prominent in Church and Civic Affairs Stricken IN POOR HEALTH MANY MONTHS Affected by Death of Husband Late Last March

Mrs. Albert G. Jones, whose husband died March 23 last, passed away at her home, 2712 Genesee Street, shortly after noon Monday. She had been in poor health for several months, and in serious condition for 10 days, but the end came unexpectedly following a heart attack.

Mrs. Jones had been active in church and charity work in this city for many years. She was a member of the board of managers of the Home for the Homeless, and served as president of the board for five years. She was a member of the board of the Women's Christian Association. Mrs. Jones had a deep interest in the affairs of the Universalist Church, and had attended its state conferences. For many years she was president of the Mission Circle of the Church of the Reconciliation, and a teacher in the Sunday school of that church, of which she was a member.

Mrs. Jones, whose maiden name was Julia W. Smith, was born in Cooperstown, December 15. 1856, daughter of Giles Crowfoot Smith and Emma Jane Wilson. When she [8?] the family moved to Utica, which had since been her home.

She was married to Mr. Jones, August [8?], 1881, the officiating clergyman being a grandfather of the bridegroom, Rev. A.[Aaron] B. Grosh, then pastor of the Church of the Reconciliation. Mr. Jones was for many years treasurer and general manager of the Utica Duxbak Corporation.

Three sons survive: Carlton B., Ralph M. and Wardwell W. Jones, all of this city, together with seven grandchildren, Marion L., Quentin M., Allen C., Esther L., Helen L., Gilbert H. and Margaret Annette. A sister, Mrs. Charles McKinney, Binghamton, also survives.
