A VICTOR MAN KILLED

Curtis A. Kellogg, senior member of the firm of Kellogg, Clark & Co., of Victor, and a man respected by every one who knew him, was killed on Saturday morning at Tiroli, near Albany, on the Central railroad. He was in the caboose of a freight train, which was run into by a following train, and he was instantly killed. Never in the history of Victor has there been such general sorrow as over the death of Mr. Kellogg. He was a prominent Mason, being Master of Milner lodge of Victor, under whose auspices he was buried. He leaves a widow [Mary Catherine Eaton Kellogg], a little daughter of nine [Charlotte "Lottie"], and one brother, Dr. Kellogg, of East Rush. It is said that Mrs. Kellogg has been rendered insane by the sad affair. The funeral occurred in Victor, at the Universalist church this afternoon.
