## THE DEPARTED

The body of Mrs. Daniel [Aramintha] Kenyon, mother of M. M. Kenyon of this place, was brought here for burial from Odell, Ill., on Saturday last, and the services were conducted from Mr. Kenyon's residence on Sunday afternoon, the pastor of the family, Rev. J. H. Moore, officiating. Mrs. Kenyon survived her husband nearly 20 years, which time had elapsed since she removed from Newark to Odell. The family came to this place some 47 years ago, and Mrs. Kenyon was about 85 years old at the time of her death. She had been in declining health many months. Her final passing away was calm and peaceful. The family consisted of the following children: Daniel<sup>1</sup>, P. W.<sup>2</sup>, Malcomb M.<sup>3</sup>, H. P.<sup>4</sup>, Mrs. Phœbe<sup>5</sup> Goodrich, Mrs. Mary<sup>6</sup> Jones, and George<sup>7</sup>.

P. W., George and Mrs. Jones of Ill. and H. P. of Clyde were present at the burial.

The family, on coming to Newark, first lived in the house now occupied by Mrs. R. S. Lay, and Mr. Kenyon on the laying out of Miller street, built the house on the site of A. D. Soverhill's residence, which is now occupied by E. P. Soverhill, farther west. Mr. and Mrs. Kenyon were earnestly devoted to the interests of the Universalist Church of this place, and since her removal Mrs. K. has regularly contributed something to its prosperity. She visited Newark for the last time about three years ago. The remains were interred in the Willow avenue cemetery.
