D. L. W. KIBBY

[On] Wednesday, Feb. 26th, at his home in Cedarville, D. L. W. Kibby succumbed to that dread disease, pneumonia. Mr. Kibby was born in the town of Winfield in 1830, but the greater part of his life was spent at Cedarville. The deceased was prominent in political circles, being one of the leading democratic politicians of the county. He was appointed postmaster at Cedarville by President Cleveland and at the time of his death held the office of Loan Commissioner, to which office he was appointed by Governor Hill. Mr. Kibby was a son-in-law of Jeremiah Myers. He was one of Columbia's best citizens and was well liked and deservedly popular with a large circle of friends. His funeral was largely attended from the Universalist Church at Cedarville Sunday noon. The services were conducted by Rev. O. B. Beals.
